What is Appraisal?

SAA Definition:

"The process of determining whether records and other materials have permanent (archival) value. Appraisal may be done at the collection, creator, series, file, or item level.

What is Appraisal?

• Identifying materials that are useful and valuable enough to have a place at your institution, in the long-term.

• The appraisal process happens within a larger context of your institution's policies and goals - collecting policy and mission statement.

Why Conduct Appraisal?

- Lack of resources to accept and care for everything
- A step to select collections that are consistent with collecting policy

Why Conduct Appraisal?

- Not all records/papers/items have archival value
- Might not be valuable to your institution/community
- Save what you can...move forward!

When Does Appraisal Occur?

- Before accepting a collection
- During accessioning
- After it is already a collection at your

institution - "Reappraisal"

Cultural and Community Value

- What are the needs and priorities in the community you serve?
- How do your collections fit into these needs and priorities?
 - During Appraisal: Evaluate materials based on these measures of cultural and community value

Other Definitions of "Value"

• Primary value: 1st life, value of the creator

• Secondary value: 2nd life, value to archive and researchers

More Kinds of "Value"

 Informational value: Usefulness of materials based solely on their content. Example: Census records to genealogists.

More Kinds of "Value"

• Evidential value: provides information about the origins, functions, and activities of their creator. How a business was created, and how it functioned over a long period of time.

What does the record tell you about the person that created it, their role, or society during the time?

More Kinds of "Value"

Intrinsic value: Value that is unique to the original physical format of the record or object (aesthetic, historical, cultural, personal).

Something that would be lost by only having a digital copy.

Other Considerations in Appraisal

- Cost
- Physical condition
- Order and completeness
- Authenticity/reliability
